AFRA MINOR

An undergraduate minor in Africana Studies is available for those students wishing to pursue related careers in this area. The program is designed to present a comprehensive study of the origins, conditions, and experiences of African Americans using the perspectives and techniques of various disciplines in the humanities and social sciences. It explores the social, political, and economic roots of contemporary problems, seeking to relate them to the major value systems in this country and the world.

Students applying for the minor in Africana Studies must have completed at least two semesters of full-time study at the University. The minor requires eighteen (18) credits, including AFRA 110, AFRA/HIST 134, AFRA 205 or AFRA 206, AFRA 304/HIST 325 or AFRA 306/HIST 326, and two (2) AFRA elective courses at the 200-level or above.

REQUIRED: AFRA 110, AFRA/HIST 134, AFRA 205 or AFRA 206, AFRA 304/HIST 325 or AFRA 306/HIST 326

ELECTIVE: Two (2) AFRA elective courses at the 200-level or above

Students who are interested in doing research related to a particular area can elect to do an independent study and/or special project on an individual basis and have this project and/or study count as elective credit. Students can only have one independent study count for elective credit.
